NJDOE UPDATES FOR HIB

- All districts and schools are required to complete School Self-Assessments to determine a grade under the Anti-Bullying Bill of Right.
- The purpose of the School Self-Assessment is to strengthen Harassment, Intimidation and Bullying (HIB) policies, programs and procedure. *Note: The Anti-Bullying Specialists and School Safety Teams are responsible for completion of the assessments.*



Eight Core Elements

- HIB Programs, Approaches or other Initiatives
- Training on the Board of Education (BOE) approved HIB Policy
- Other Staff Instruction and Training Programs
- Curriculum and Instruction on HIB and related Information
- HIB Personnel
- School Level HIB Incident Reporting Procedures
- HIB Investigation Procedure
- HIB Reporting



Point System and Rubric Scoring

The School Self -
Assessments are based
on point system and
rubric scoring with a
maximum of 75 points.

- Does not meet the requirements= 0 points
- Partially meets the requirements=1 point
- Meets all requirement=2 points
- Exceeds the requirements-=3 points
