A. Staff Development

The Interim Superintendent of Schools recommends, and I so move, adoption of the following:

RESOLUTION

1. New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association (N.J.S.I.A.A.)

To improve the recruitment, retention and development of district staff.

The Plainfield Board of Education is committed to ensuring that all students succeed academically and reach their full potential in life and to improve the learning and academic performance of all student in PPS. In doing so, it is also committed to providing opportunities for and ensuring that all student and athletes to meet the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards and achieve academic and life-long success.

New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association (N.J.S.I.A.A.) will provide training for sixty (60) coaches in varied sports. These workshops are designed to train coaches in current rules and regulations. These workshops also provide training to the coaches in current techniques and trends. NJSIAA will conduct workshops for the Plainfield Board of Education Athletic Coaches throughout the 2010-2011 school year.

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approves payment to NJSIAA in an amount not to exceed \$3,000.00 for providing training to sixty (60) coaches in their specific sport and will be charged to account 11-000-240000-800A-27-0000.

2. NJASK Literature Based Assessment Workshops

The Plainfield Board of Education recognizes that a highly qualified, competent, skilled, and dedicated workforce is essential to the success of the District and the students. The Plainfield Board of Education is committed to ensuring that all students succeed academically and reach their full potential in life. In doing so, it is also committed to providing opportunities for and ensuring that all students (inclusive of English Language Learners and Special Education Students) meet the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards and achieve academic and life-long success.

Michael Wojcik and Ernest Ciardi will provide two full day hands-on workshops to Cedarbrook K-8 Center teachers in 1st and 2nd grade, all ancillary staff, as well as any incoming staff members for the 2010-2011 school year. Through this series of workshops and modeling sessions, teachers will be trained in areas such as creating practice NJASK writing prompts, poetry prompts, expository prompts, and in getting our students to use compositional risks to score higher on open-ended reading and writing sections. Hands-on Activities include:

- Using concrete activities to master abstract/advanced skills
- Using picture books to teach figurative language
- Using everyday objects to teach figurative language

Michael Wojcik's leadership experience includes 39 years in public education and administrative experience including special education, guidance, scheduling child study team support services, state mandated testing training and curriculum and instruction. During his tenure as Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and instruction for Hackensack Public Schools, he was responsible for implementing major educational reforms with the Hackensack School District resulting in national and state recognition. He successfully eliminated the "achievement gap" resulting in six of seven district schools making AYP with NCLB and three schools being removed from New Jersey DOE "Needs Improvement List."

During Ernest Ciardi tenure as District Supervisor of Language Arts Literacy for West New York School District, he has presented workshops for grades K-12 demonstrating strategies to teach NJASK, HSPA skills and the Core Curriculum Content Standards using classroom materials. In addition, he has served as a presenter at the N. J. Federal Programs Administrators Conferences for the past 11 years.

RESOLVED, that the Plainfield Board of Education approves payment of a fee in the amount of \$1,400.00 to Ernest Ciardi for providing 2 full days of professional development and \$1,400.00 to Michael Wojcik for providing 2 full days of professional development during the scheduled Professional Development days (September 2 *and* September 3, 2010); for a *total of \$2,800.00* and charged to account 15-000-223000-320A-13-0000. 3. E-Rate 2010 Fall Applicant Training

The Plainfield Board of Education recognizes that a highly qualified, competent, skilled, and dedicated workforce is essential to the success of the district and the students. Therefore, it has provided the Superintendent of Schools the authority to employ non-administrative and administrative staff members to participate in out-of-district professional development opportunities.

The Schools and Libraries Program of the Universal Service Fund, commonly known as "E-Rate," is administered by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) under the direction of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), and provides discounts to assist most schools and libraries in the United States to obtain affordable telecommunications and Internet access. It is one of four support programs funded through a Universal Service fee charged to companies that provide interstate and/or international telecommunications services.

This training is for applicants who participate in the Universal Service Fund's Schools and Libraries (E-rate) Program. The training will cover general E-rate topics and participants will have opportunities to meet USAC staff and discuss the challenges schools and libraries face when applying for E-rate funding.

Gary Bloom, Interim Coordinator of Information Technology and Support Services and Aliqua Jones, Secretary of Information Technology and Support Services to attend the Fall 2010 Applicant Training on Thursday, October 7, 2010 at Newark Liberty International Airport Marriott in Newark, NJ from 8:00AM to 5:00PM. There is no cost to the district

RESOLVED, that the Plainfield Board of Education approves Gary Bloom, Interim Coordinator of Information Technology and Support Services and Aliqua Jones, Secretary of Information Technology and Support Services to attend The Fall 2010 Applicant Training at no cost to the district.

4. Somerset Medical Center

6. The Foundation for Educational Administration – Legal One

The Plainfield Board of Education recognizes that a highly qualified, competent, skilled and dedicated workforce is essential to the success of the District and the students. Therefore, it has provided the Interim Superintendent of Schools the authority to employ non-administrative and administrative staff members to participate in out-of-district Professional Development opportunities.

Training in school law through Legal One is provided by the Foundation for Educational Administration. Legal One is an online training program that meets the legal requirement for all New Jersey school leaders to complete 12 hours of professional training in school law, governance and ethics by June 30, 2013. Legal One is designed to meet the professional development requirement as provided in N.J.S.A. 18A:26-8.2 and became effective in March 2007, and the corresponding regulatory requirement contained within N.J.A.C. 6A:9-16.7 and was adopted by the New Jersey State Board of Education in November 2008.

The Foundation for Educational Administration will provide the state mandated training for 20 district administrators who are required to complete the four modules at a cost of registration is \$300.00 per person not to exceed \$6,000.00.

RESOLVED, that the Plainfield Board of Education approves the Foundation for Educational Administration to provide Legal One mandated and one advance workshop on a to be determined date during the administrators' retreat at a cost not to exceed \$6,000.00 and to be charged to account 11-000-223000-320T-26-0000 .

7. Teachers College Columbia University Reading & Writing Project – Plainfield Public Schools

Strategic Plan Link:

Goal 1: Learning Outcomes:

To improve the learning and academic performance of all students in all Plainfield Public Schools.

Goal 2: Human Resources:

To improve the recruitment, retention and development of district staff.

The Plainfield Board of Education has identified an instructional need for professional development for teachers in writing. Data confirms that schools that commit to systematic professional development with the Teachers College Columbia University Reading and Writing Project experience significant improvement in students' ELA test scores as compared to their peers in non-Project schools.

Lucy Calkins is the author of many books on the teaching of reading and writing, including two foundational texts: *The Art of Teaching Reading* (Pearson), and *The Art of Teaching Writing*. Her other publications include *One-to-One: The Art of Conferring with Young Writers*, the series: *Units of Study for Primary Writing: A Yearlong Curriculum* and *Units of Study for Teaching Writing, Grades 3-5*.

TC Reading and Writing Project will provide professional development to all K-5 district teachers in writing for 2 full days. Workshops for K-2 will be offered one day and grades 3-5 on a separate day, not to exceed \$5,000.00 and for a maximum of 100 staff members on each day.

The College will offer additional training/coaching to one school Emerson that will serve as a model for the district at a rate of \$1,750.00 per day for a total of 5 days throughout the year.

RESOLVED, that the Plainfield Board of Education approves payment to Teachers College Reading and Writing Project the amount of \$5000 for the 2 full day workshops and district administrators and \$8,750.00 for 5 days of school based professional development and coaching in writing. Availability of funds for this item has been verified and will be charged to account numbers 11-000-223000-320T-26-0000 and Emerson School Budget at a cost of \$13,750.

D. Summer Programming (WIB TANF)

Strategic Plan Link:

Goal 1: Learning Outcomes

To improve the learning and academic performance of all students in all PPS.

The Plainfield Board of Education is committed to ensuring that all students succeed academically and reach their full potential as productive citizens. To this end, the Department of Student Intervention and Family Support Services has applied for and received funding of \$38,400 from the Union County Workforce Investment Board/Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (WIB TANF) programs.

The Union County WIB is charged with helping economically disadvantaged youth ages 17 through 21 to improve academic performance in school, access job training and higher education opportunities, gain the skills needed to progress in career goals, and obtain employment.

The Department of Student Intervention and Family Support Services through the School Based Youth Services Program will implement a summer work program that will provide work-related experience to 20 students ranging from 17 to 21 years of age. The program will give the students the opportunity to develop appropriate skills necessary to be successful in school and in the workplace.

It is recommended that permission be granted to compensate the 20 students who will participate in this summer work program. They will be compensated at \$7.25 per hour for a maximum of \$913.50.

Compensation for all students will be provided through funding by the WIA/TANF grant. The program will operate Monday-Thursday 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. from July 12, 2010 through August 12, 2010.

RESOLVED, that the Plainfield Board of Education approves the hiring of the students to work in the Student Intervention and Family Support Services School Based summer work program. There will be no cost to the district.

E. Approval: Partnership Agreement – Rutgers University Masters Prepared Intern Program

The Interim Superintendent of Schools recommends, and I so move, adoption of the following:

RESOLUTION

The Plainfield Board of Education is committed to ensuring that all students succeed academically and reach their full potential as productive citizens. To this end, the Department of Student Intervention and Family Support Services would like to continue the existing partnership with Rutgers University College of Social Work to ensure the enhancement of and delivery of support services to students and their families; and to provide an intern experience up to 15 Master-level Social Work Students.

The program will be monitored and administered by Stacy Greene, Coordinator Student Intervention and Family Support Services, who is a licensed, clinical Social Worker in the state of New Jersey. Interns would be placed throughout the District and paired up with licensed Social Workers. The program would begin on September 13, 2010 and run until May 20, 2011. The implementation of the program would be at no cost to the district.

RESOLVED, that the Plainfield Board of Education approves this joint venture with the Rutgers University College of Social Work for the 2010-2011 school year.

WHEREAS, Educational Data Services will provide a standardized bid process in conjunction with educational training programs, computerized inventories and labels for hazardous substances, development of a file of material safety data sheets/fact sheets and bidding for the disposal of unwanted chemical wastes, now therefore be it
