All CAP programs utilize a three-pronged approach to community prevention education: training of staff, parents and children.

The EDS/SIFSS will apply for funding to implement all three components of the workshops at various elementary and middle schools in the district. The elementary workshops consist of one-hour classroom workshops facilitated by three CAP leaders. The teen workshops are designed for adolescents, and presented by a male and female facilitator in three 40-45 minute classroom periods. Workshops are held in individual classrooms. The programs include discussions about personal safety rights, types of assaults, and effective strategies for handling many potentially dangerous situations. In addition, special needs workshops designed for developmentally disabled students will be conducted in the intermediate grades. (1) Bloodborne Pathogens Management Services Agreement

WHEREAS, the local public school districts are required to comply with educational and procedural guidelines for occupational exposure to bloodborne pathogens according to New Jersey Department of Labor regulations N.J.A.C. 12:100-4.2 et seq., and

(3) **2009-2010 Nonpublic School Technology Initiative Program**

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the public school district to send written verification that conferences were held with each nonpublic school administrator to the Executive County Superintendent, along with a copy of each agreement, and

WHEREAS, it shall be the responsibility of each public school district to provide the agreed upon technology which may include equipment, software, professional development and/or maintenance of equipment, and

WHEREAS, the Union County Educational Services Commission has agreed to handle the responsibilities associated with this program for the purpose of greater cost effectiveness through joint purchasing and centralized administration, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Plainfield Board of Education enters into an agreement with the Union County Educational Services Commission whereby the Commission will administer the Nonpublic School Initiative Program for nonpublic schools located within its boundaries for the 2009-2010 school year, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Plainfield Board of Education pays 5% of the allocation for the Nonpublic School Technology Initiative Program to cover the Commission's cost for administering the program.
