The program is based on extensive social scientific research and previous piloting in other public middle and high schools.

The Roots Program focuses on changing students' perception of acceptable and desirable behavior, through a bottom-up "grassroots" intervention that centers on students' perceptions of their social worlds. The intervention will track our school's HIB climate using student surveys that are administered to all students three times throughout the 2012-2013 school year.
