**Mr. Justin Sears**

The Superintendent of Schools recommends, and I so move, adoption of the following:

**RESOLUTION**

**WHEREAS** Justin Sears, Cook School Alumni and former Plainfield High School Basketball player was named the 2014-15 Ivy League Player of the Year and an Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American. He becomes the first Yale player to earn All-American recognition since Butch Graves in 1984.

**WHEREAS** this season Justin Sears was named the most valuable player at the Men Against Breast Cancer Classic, helping the Bulldogs to three wins in three days. This season he was a five-time Ivy League player of the week selection becoming second on the all-time list with ten career Ivy League Player of the Week selections. In addition, he was named to the Lou Henson Award Mid-Season Watch List. The Lou Henson Award is presented annually to the Division I "Mid Major" Player of the Year.

**WHEREAS** Justin Sears, a two-time first team All-Ivy selection, is third all-time at Yale with 152 blocked shots and sixth with 366 career made free throws. This season he reached the 1,000 career point mark and is 10<sup>th</sup> all-time at Yale with 1,260 career points. Justin led the Bulldogs to a share of the Ivy League title, winning 22 games, the most by a Yale team since 1948-49.

**WHEREAS** Justin Sears has accomplished this while maintaining a 3.2 GPA and participating in several campus based extracurricular activities.
