MINUTES of a **BUSINESS** Meeting of the Board of
Education Held on Tuesday, June 20, 2006

A **BUSINESS** Meeting of the Board of Education of the City of Plainfield was held this day in the Plainfield School, library. Notice had been provided to Board members and to the Courier-News, Star Ledger, Public Library, City Clerk, Comcast Cable Co., Plainfield Police Department, and posted in all Plainfield Public schools. The meeting was called to order at 6:35 p.m. by Ms. Patricia Barksdale, Vice President, and the following action took place:

The Board of Education adjourned into its executive session at 6:35 p.m.

The Board of Education resumed the public session of its Business Meeting at 7:15 p.m.

IV. REMARKS FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

Mr. Cathcart presented a plaque to Timothy Green, in his absentia, for his generosity of six computers to various schools.

Mr. Cathcart acknowledged the Guidance Department and their efforts; students received a total of \$113,000 in scholarships. Miss Miller's students from Maxson School did a poetry presentation.

XI. PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Diane Yglesias had questions regarding Power School. She spoke about negotiations. Mr. Payne answered questions regarding Power School.

Sharon Robinson-Briggs had applications for employment for students. She also shared requests she received from the community regarding Board issues.

Joanne Hollis said she had not received the computer she purchased through Cedarbrook School. Dr. Howard said there were no sanctioned sales through the Plainfield School district.

Plainfield is only one of four schools in the county that have an automotive program.

XII. REPORT OF THE HUMAN RESOURCES COMMITTEE
