A **BUSINESS** Meeting of the Board of Education of the City of Plainfield was held this day in the Plainfield High School, auditorium. Notice had been provided to Board members and to the Courier-News, Star Ledger, Public Library, City Clerk, Plainfield Police Department, and posted in all Plainfield Public Schools and the District's website. #### IV. REMARKS FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

Mrs. Hernandez indicated that we will be going back to executive session later tonight to finish the agenda.

#### V. REMARKS FROM THE INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT

Mrs. Belin-Pyles indicated she is excited about the future as district initiatives and opportunities had taken place and will continue to do so. She was also encouraged last night by student recognition at Washington School as over 200 attended this event. The Debate Team, ROTC, VIP, 21<sup>st</sup> Century and Leader Excellence all had a number of student recognitions. She thanked the staff who put it all together and parents for their support.

Mrs. Belin-Pyles distributed information to the Board regarding Comcast providing internet service at a low cost for students and their families. This was not an endorsement for Comcast, but an opportunity to provide a service.

#### VI. PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Joyce Gerstorfer spoke in support of Mrs. Belin-Pyles as Interim Superintendent, partly due to the fact that she lives in Plainfield.

Jeff Truitt supports both Mrs. Belin-Pyles and the Board in their efforts and especially appreciated recognition on the debate team.

Woodland school staff spoke together to thank the Board for the guidance counselor but they do need a dedicated nurse.

Debra Williams spoke on behalf of her grandson's kindergarten teacher at Woodland School; who has been RIF'd.

Other parents spoke in support of Woodland School teacher, Ms. Kahn.

Cheryl Nagel Smiley echoed Mrs. Gerstorfer's comments about Mrs. Belin-Pyles' excellent role as superintendent. She also indicated that Sodexo workers at Hubbard are wonderful.

Connie Jenkins Buwa expressed concern that a room at PAAAS will be occupied by a pre-k class.

Katherine Cardona indicated that many sentiments expressed earlier tonight were her concerns as well. She also is looking for answers to budget transfers.

Maria Pellum had four (4) simple questions related to world language teachers, overcrowding at Evergreen, background checks of board members and lastly planned restructuring of middle schools.

Mrs. Hernandez spoke on behalf of PAAAS students and their support for Spanish teacher Ms. Arias.

Sandra Burton spoke in support of Cedarbrook's world language teacher. She also questions where is the ratified PEA contract?

Mrs. Logan-Leach made a point of order – that sitting board members cannot go to the floor to speak as a private citizen.

Ms. Barksdale spoke about the need for walk-ons to the C&I agenda.

Mrs. Gilbert attended a UCESC meeting recently that dealt with superintendent contracts and attendance at meetings.

Mrs. Campbell indicated that there will be HR walk-ons later tonight.

Mrs. Gilbert reported that Cedarbrook recently had an awards ceremony.

Mr. Abdul-Haqq looks forward to attending leadership committee meetings at PHS in the future.

Mrs. Hernandez participated in Stillman's career day and Jefferson's spring concert family fun day. Also, PAAAS had their 8<sup>th</sup> grade dance.

Ms. Barksdale echoed Mrs. Hernandez comments about the recent performance of The Wiz – We have talent in Plainfield. The PAAAS 8<sup>th</sup> grade dance was amazing as well.

Mrs. Logan-Leach has not been here due to personal issues and therefore does not have a report on Maxson.

Mrs. Barksdale wants to discuss at the board retreat the possibility of recording the minutes. She has a concern about the organization minutes and, she couldn't find anything about a food selection committee either.

The 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC/SBYS Summer Enrichment Camp helps students develop core content skills by way of facilitation of activity-based instruction, offering them a broad array of enrichment, recreational and cultural activities that complement their regular school year academic programs. The Camp implements educational services to the families of participating children by way of community collaborators in the area of character education, personal responsibility, parental role in core content areas, and technology skills.

The Department of Student Intervention and Family Support Services has applied for and been awarded funding in the amount of \$535,000.00 from The New Jersey Department of Education to develop and implement 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Centers for up to one hundred twenty (120) students in the 2011 Summer Enrichment Camp to take place at Washington Community School (4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> grades) and Plainfield High School (6<sup>th</sup> –12<sup>th</sup> grades). The program will operate Monday – Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. beginning Tuesday, July 5, 2011 through Friday, August 5, 2011.

A grant mandated component of the 2011 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC/SBYS Summer Enrichment Camp is to build upon student learning outside the summer classroom by providing field trips which expose students to various recreational, cultural, and enrichment opportunities.

These field trips will meet NJCCCS including 6.1/6.2 where all students will acquire the knowledge and skills to think analytically about how past and present interactions of people, culture, and environment affect issues across time and culture as well as shape American heritage. This will enable students to make informed decisions as productive citizens in local, national, and global communities; 9.1 where all students will demonstrate the creative, critical thinking, collaboration, and problem-solving skills needed to function successfully as both global citizens and workers in diverse ethnic and organizational cultures. Active engagement of families and community members in the educational process of our students is a key. With a fast growing Spanish speaking community in Plainfield, there is an increase need for district and school personnel to communicate information to parents in their native language (Spanish). Participants will master the basic communication with students and parents in Spanish. To promote Conversational Spanish skills to building administrators, teachers and support staff, Classes will be offered during the month of June for 1 week, for approximately 25 staff members.

The NCLB legislation provide districts with funding (Title III- Immigrant Fund) to provide parents with information pertaining to their children's education in their native language (Spanish). At the end of the course, students have a good understanding of the written and oral Spanish language at the basic level, and Participants should be able to discuss concepts and applications with their peers and instructor with confidence. It is recommended that the Office of Bilingual/ESL/WL compensate one teacher at a rate of \$28.00 per hour not to exceed \$980.00 for instruction.

The expertise acquired through the Orton –Gillingham training will allow teachers to deliver explicit instruction in the identified key areas while utilizing and strengthening all learning pathways. Additionally, teachers will be provided with ongoing assessment and progress monitoring tools necessary to quickly and continuously evaluate each student's individual needs. Training will be tailored to ensure that any teacher can immediately integrate this program into their whole group, small group, or one-to-one language instructional time frame. Orton-Gillingham is intended to complement, not replace, the core reading curricula already in use throughout the district. Teachers in attendance will be compensated with a \$100.00 per day stipend.
